

What you can take in your hand baggage

To ease your journey, we suggest that you pack most items in your hold baggage and that items you carry in hand baggage are limited to what you need whilst on-board the aircraft or valuable items only.

Allowed

Drinks

- Any drinks in cans, bottles, plastic containers or cartons of 100mls or less.¹

Food

- Sandwiches.
- Crisps.
- Fruit.
- Vegetables.
- Wedding cake.
- Other solid foods.
- Jams and syrups.¹
- Soups.¹
- Stews.¹
- Sauces.¹
- Pastes.¹
- Foods in sauces or dishes with a high liquid content.¹
- Yoghurts or fruit juices.¹

Baby products

Only carry what you need for your trip.

- Baby milk.²
- Sterilised water.²
- Baby juice.²
- Baby food in liquid, gel or paste form.²
- Powdered baby food.
- Pushchairs/prams/buggies (but you will need to lift your child out so that the item can be X-rayed at security).
- Car seats (for use on the plane). They do not count as your single bag.
- Wet wipes.

Electrical items

Large electrical items must be removed from hand baggage for separate inspection. Smaller items may be left within your hand baggage or in your coat/jacket pocket.

- MP3 player/music or CD player.⁷
- Portable DVD player.⁷
- Laptop computer.⁷
- Digital camera.⁸
- Mobile phone.⁸
- Spare batteries.
- Gas hair tongs.⁹

Cosmetics and toiletries

- Brush/comb.
- Fully disposable razors/razor cartridges.
- Toothbrushes.
- Disposable contact lenses in sealed packaging, sufficient for the flight (one or two pairs).
- Non-disposable contact lenses in carrier with small amount of solution.
- Contact lens solution.¹
- Toothpaste.¹
- Mascara.¹
- Talcum powder.
- Hairspray and other aerosol items.¹
- Solid deodorants.
- Atomiser/cream/roll-on deodorants.¹
- Suntanning products.¹
- Lipsticks.
- Lip gloss or lip balms.¹
- Creams.¹
- Soap (solid bars).
- Soap (liquid/pump containers).¹

Medicines/medical equipment

Essential medicines should be carried in containers of not more than 100ml and they must be in your transparent re-sealable bag. If your medicines are in containers over 100ml or your medicines and liquids together exceed the capacity of the bag you will need the **prior approval of your airline**. You should carry with you the proof of prescription or a statement that you need the medicine from your doctor or medical professional.

- Essential prescribed medicines, including angina spray.³
- Essential non-prescribed medicines.³
- Children's medicines, such as Calpol.³
- Essential medical equipment.⁴
- Insulin, hypodermic needles, epipen.²
- Inhaler (spare canisters must be packed in your hold baggage).
- Homeopathic medication.³

Smoking materials

- Cigarettes, cigars, rolling tobacco.
- Cigarette papers.
- A single box of safety matches.

Allowed

Writing implements

- Biro, rollerball pens, gel pens.
- Fountain pens with a single, open cartridge in use.
- Refills for pens.¹
- Pencils.

Miscellaneous

- Books, puzzle books, games, stickers.
- **Musical instruments.**⁵
- Hat box.⁶
- Wedding dress.⁶
- Sports equipment.⁶

Key

- 1 Need to be in containers 100ml or less, and go into your one transparent, re-sealable bag.
- 2 To be tasted/verified by the passenger.
- 3 If the medicine is in containers of more than 100ml or your medicines and liquids together exceed the capacity of the transparent re-sealable bag you will need the **prior approval of your airline**. You should carry with you the proof of prescription or a statement that you need the medicine from your doctor or medical professional.
- 4 You will require **prior approval of your airline**, unless it fits within your one item of hand baggage. It should be clearly labelled 'Essential medical equipment' and you will be asked to verify this at the security checkpoint.
- 5 In addition to your one item of hand baggage allowance.
- 6 As your one item of hand baggage.
- 7 These items will need to be removed and screened separately.
- 8 Place these items in your hand baggage or jacket, so that they can go through the X-ray machine.
- 9 Spare canisters must be packed in your hold baggage.

Not allowed

Drinks

- Any drinks in cans, bottles, plastic containers, cardboard cartons, over 100ml in size.

Food

- Any liquid-based foods, sauces, stews, soups, over 100ml in size.

Cosmetics and toiletries

- Any liquids, gels, creams or aerosols, over 100ml in size.

Medicines

- Any liquids, gels, creams or aerosols, over 100ml in size, unless agreed with your airline.

Smoking materials

- Cigarette lighters. But one cigarette lighter may be carried on your person.
- Non-safety matches.

Sharp items

- Razor blades (razors that have the blade set into a plastic moulding are allowed, but razors that can be opened and the razor blade removed are prohibited).
- Knives with blades of any length.
- Scissors.
- Household cutlery (large spoons/ tablespoons are **NOT** permitted, however small teaspoons are allowed).
- Hypodermic needles (unless required for medical reasons, for which proof will be required).
- Tools (including multi-tools and penknives).
- Catapults.
- Corkscrews.
- Walking/hiking poles.
- Toy/replica guns (metal or plastic).
- Sporting bats.
- Darts.
- Billiard, snooker or pool cues.
- Any other sharp edged or sharp pointed objects.
